Bohemian, beatnik, beggar - the blind street  
musician Louis Hardin, who dressed as a  
Viking, was called many things. The name he  
gave himself was Moondog. He spent most of

music, composing, and handing out  
pamphlets of his poetry and musical  
philosophy. But inside the horned helmet  
was the mind of a serious composer. One  
writer describes his music as 'a unique  
amalgam of Amerindian percussion, jazzy  
riffing, European counterpoint and  
troubadour balladeering'.  
Ryan Smith explores the weird and
